D-DAY: FROM NORMANDY TO BERLIN ON DISPLAY THROUGH MAY 31, 2025

2024 marked the 80th anniversary of the D-Day landings at Normandy in northern France.

Many lowans were involved in those landings, the liberation of Europe and the ending of the Holocaust. Nearly 227,000 lowans served in the war and almost 8,400 died.

In commemoration of that struggle for liberty, the exhibit showcases the D-Day landings and the year-long struggle through northern Europe.

SIPPING ON HISTORY with Margaret

Happy 2025 one and all! I hope you were all able to enjoy the holiday season and spend it how you needed, whether that was with loved ones or getting much-needed rest. I managed to do both and feel invigorated and focused to tackle the next six months of our fiscal year.

The staff continue to do amazing things, as you will see throughout this newsletter. As we move into the second half of the year, we are doing a deep dive into finances to identify any gaps and develop strategies to meet those needs. The biggest gap that remains a continued concern is the loss of the voter-approved levy due to changes in state legislation.

When the legislature passed HF718, it consolidated the Cultural and Scientific Facility levy with several other levies and set a maximum levy rate that cities are allowed to collect. The voters of Waterloo passed the Cultural and Scientific Facilities levy in 2015, in which 27 cent per \$1,000 value on property taxes was designated to support the Grout Museum District. HF718 eliminated this designation, and the money collected now goes to the General Fund for the city. Waterloo's city budget now determines what, if any, portion of funding the Grout receives.

This change has already negatively impacted the museum's operations. Since its passage in 2015, the levy supplied an average of \$660,000 annually, roughly 40% of the operating budget. These funds covered utilities, general maintenance, and other overhead expenses that are not typically funded through other revenue streams. Since HF718 passed, there has been a \$40,000 reduction in support from the city.

This reduction means that there are three staff positions that are unfilled and will remain unfilled. A few members of the staff also had their hours reduced as well. Funding that would support growth in programs or capital improvements now must be diverted to meet our overhead expenses. Any further reductions would have even more serious negative consequences for the organization.


The Trustees, the finance director, and I are actively developing strategies to contend with these changes, but we need the entire Grout community's help in this endeavor. Your donations and memberships are more vital than ever. When you bring your family and friends to our museums, our events, and other programming, you help us expand our reach and share our value. Please continue to support us in our fundraising efforts and spread the word of our impact on the Cedar Valley community. I am also finalizing letters of support that citizens can send to government officials about HF718 and its impact. More information regarding that will follow.


